

Term 3, a blast!



The students have been working very hard and making great progress towards achieving their individual learning goals.

During weeks 1 and 2 our literacy focus was poetry. The students have learnt how to write an acrostic poem and a free verse poem. The senior students learnt how to use simile and metaphor in their writing. Their poems were fabulous! Some of our students have entered their poems into the National Tree Day, writing competition, it is wonderful to have authentic audiences for our writing.

On the 24th of July our school hosted the Victorian Launch of the Callister
Foundation's—Happy Little Vegemites, schools program. We were delighted to welcome Jamie and Libby to our school. Jamie, the grandson of Cyril Callister, the inventor of vegemite, told us about his grandfather's creation and the struggles he endured, and the persistence he showed, in trying to launch vegemite into the Australian market.

Cyril was born in Chute, a small village between Amphitheatre and Beaufort. Cyril's journey provides us with the important message, that we should never feel defined by our postcode, that all things are possible given persistence and hard work!

Our students had already been experimenting with vegemite as a medium for art during Full STEAM Ahead cluster days, and knew that it could be applied thickly like impasto or thinly like water colour. We were excited to welcome Beaufort artist, Angela Gerard to our classroom. Angela extended the children's learning by teaching them how to create a still life "painting" using vegemite as the medium. The results were beautiful!

We thank the Callister Foundation and Angela Gerrard for their kindness in choosing our school to be the launch pad for such an exciting initiative.

We have been eagerly planning for the development of our school orchard, a beautiful addition to our kitchen garden. Our grateful thanks go to Dave Grinter, for digging the holes for our trees. We so appreciate the support that is shown to us by our families, support is what makes small schools tick!

This week the children have planted a lemon, a nectarine and a peach tree. Next week we will plant some more fruit trees. We have chosen varieties that fruit during school terms, so that we can enjoy harvesting the results of our work together.

Last week the children created a delicious apple and pear jam! This coming week we will enjoy using the jam in our cooking lesson.

In numeracy the children have been learning about fractions, they have worked hard to embed their understanding of this sometimes tricky maths concept. We discussed that fractions are found everywhere in our everyday lives, especially when we are sharing

During the next two weeks our literacy focus will be, scripts. The children will enjoy reading and acting out small plays. Stay tuned..... as there maybe an invitation coming your way.


If you have any questions please come and chat to us, we are always at the gate at pick up time, and love the chance to catch up with you.
